- During the 1970's, a number of practitioners in the Health Education field grew and interest expanded.
- By the early 1980's, OSOPHE was a blend of health educators and health education faculty from colleges/universities.
- In 1995, the first \$500 student scholarship was given by the organization.
- In 1997, the organization helped to plan the Ohio Combined Public Health Conference.
- In 1983, OSOPHE received official recognition from the IRS and it's tax exempt status.
- In 2011, OSOPHE received it's 501c3 status.
- Since the 1970's the organization has grown tremendously.

The Health Educator

A Health Educator is professionally prepared and possesses knowledge and skills based upon research to promote health behavior change in individuals and populations. Health Education draws from various sciences to promote health to prevent disease, disability, and premature death.

Health Educators provide information on health and health related issues. They can assess health training needs and plan health education programs. They may specialize in specific health concerns, illnesses, or work settings. Health educators may work as independent consultants or in health departments, community organizations, businesses, hospitals or schools.

Health Educators perform health assessments, design and develop health programs, implement policy, system, and environmental change strategies as a means of reducing chronic disease, publish education materials, develop curriculum, and teach health in schools.
